(The clergy then chant the Paschal verses with the choir singing the Troparion "Christ is risen..." after each verse.)

Choir: Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and upon those in the tombs bestowing life!

Priest: As smoke vanishes so let them vanish; as wax melts before the fire!

Choir: Christ is risen from the dead...

Priest: So the sinners will perish before the face of God. But let the righteous be glad!

Priest: This is the day which the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!

Deacon: Wisdom! Upright!

Tone 8 Hypakoe (Pascha)

Before the <u>dawn</u> <u>Mary</u> and the <u>wom</u>en

came and found the stone rolled away from the tomb.

They heard the angelic <u>voice</u>: "Why do you seek among the <u>dead</u> as a Man the One Who is everlasting Light?

Behold the <u>clothes</u> in the <u>grave</u>; go and pro<u>claim</u> to the world:

'The Lord is risen; He has slain death,

as He is the Son of God, saving the race of man."

KONTAKION

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 8 Kontakion** (*Pascha*)

You descended <u>in</u>to the <u>tomb</u>, O Im<u>mor</u>tal,

You destroyed the power of death.

In victory You arose, O Christ God,

proclaiming: "Rejoice!" to the Myrrhbearing Women,//

granting peace to Your Apostles, and bestowing Resurrection on the fallen.

(Instead of the Trisagion, we sing:)

As many as have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ. Alleluia.

The prokeimenon in the third tone: My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior. ($Lk\ 1:46-47$)

v: For He has regarded the low estate of His handmaiden, for behold, all generations will call me blessed. (Lk 1:48)

THE READING IS FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

In those days Peter, standing up with the eleven, raised his voice and said to them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and heed my words. For these are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 'And it shall come to pass in the last days, says God, that I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your young men shall see visions, your old men shall dream dreams. And on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days; and they shall prophesy. I will show wonders in heaven above and signs in the earth beneath: blood and fire and vapor of smoke. The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the coming of the great and fearful day of the LORD. And it shall come to pass that whoever calls on the Name of "LORD" shall be saved.'

GOSPEL Luke 24:12-35

(Instead of "It is truly meet ...," we sing:)

The Angel cried to the Lady, full of grace:

"Rejoice, O pure Virgin! Again, I say: 'Rejoice,

your Son is risen from His three days in the tomb!

With Himself He has raised all the dead."

Rejoice, O ye people!

Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem!

The glory of the Lord has shone on you.

Exult now, and be glad, O Zion!

Be radiant, O pure Theotokos,

in the Resurrection of your Son!

COMMUNION HYMN

Receive the Body of Christ; taste the fountain of immortality! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

Instead of "Blessed is He that comes in the Name of the Lord," we sing **Christ is risen ... (once).**

Instead of "We have seen the True Light" we sing: **Christ is risen ..." (once).**

Instead of "Let our mouths be filled ...," we sing **Christ is risen ..." (once).**

Instead of "Blessed be the Name of the Lord," we sing **Christ is risen ... (three times).**

After "The blessing of the Lord be upon you..." the Procession with the Gospels.

Choir: Christ is risen from the dead...

Deacon: And that we be accounted worthy of hearing the holy Gospel, let us implore

the Lord our God.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (x3)

Deacon: Wisdom! Upright! Let us hear the holy Gospel!

Priest: Peace to all!

Choir: And to your spirit.

Priest: The reading from the holy gospel according to (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)

Choir: Glory to you, O Lord! Glory to you!

Deacon: Let us attend!

Priest: (reads the gospel)

Choir: Glory to you, O Lord! Glory to you!

Choir: Christ is risen from the dead... (and so for the four readings from the gospel)

Instead of "Glory to You, O Christ our God...,"

Priest: Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death

Choir: and upon those in the tombs bestowing life.

The priest gives the Dismissal, and after the singing of "Christ is risen" (three times), we finish with:

And unto us He has given eternal life. Let us worship His Resurrection on the third day!
