Holy Communion – for Orthodox Christians, please note that there are specific disciplines regarding receiving Communion – fasting from midnight (unless you need to take medication) and recent Confession. If you are an Orthodox Christian from another parish who has prepared in accordance with your discipline, and have a blessing from your home priest to do so, we invite and encourage you to partake of Holy Communion

For our visitors who are not Orthodox Christian: we welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. The Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (antidoron) which will be given when coming forward to receive the final blessing from the priest at the conclusion of the Liturgy. **Again, welcome!**

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE finances Please continue your tithes and offerings so that we can finish the year in the black. Susie Ford, treasurer, reported that the balance sheet has increased slightly from October. endowment report no report. rector's report written report submitted. Many new visitors and inquirers. Father Peter Bistolarides was elevated to protopresbyter by Metropolitan Nicholas of Detroit (Greek Archdiocese). Vision plan was printed in December newsletter and will be posted large-size in fellowship hall. Church school/youth ministry Stephanie Price reported that we need six Orthodox Study Bibles needed for the middle school/high school class. Rent a bounce house, snow cone machine and do hamburgers and hot dogs on the Sunday of Church school recognition at church. Most bags given for St Nicholas Day in quite a few years. *community outreach* 2025 Stephanie Price prepared our community outreach calendar for 2025 and it will be shared in our newsletter. *fundraiser* Cookie Walk is Saturday, December 14 from 10 am to 1 pm. *charity* North End Soup Kitchen is on Thursday, January 2 from 9 am to 12:30 pm. maintenance Dennis Jernigan cleaned leaves off roof which needs to be done every season. Planning to create a schedule of regular maintenance and other items that need to be done every year, season by season, month by month. Stoves in kitchen need to be cleaned once a year - perhaps in November each year before St Nicholas day. Exterior front door was repaired and new threshold was put in with new hydraulic piston so it does not slam shut. Weather seals will be added to the bottom of both doors. City of Burton was contacted with drain issue in south parking lot and crack in asphalt near our entrance way. City representative said they will add these items to their list to examine. Air handler needed repair work. Sanitation line needs to be augured out. Salting of front porch of church and sidewalks will be applied by parishioners so that we use the appropriate salt rather than our snow removal company having to use two different salts. *old business* Connie Maxim reported that \$93 was net for the three gift baskets on December 8. Dennis Jernigan said the hand rail is being used on the front steps of church which is great. *new business* Theophany dinner is Sunday, January 12. Dave Houser will prepare the lamb. Sharon Jernigan and Kathy Gonser will work to put together the dinner. \$18 per plate. Children 12 and under eat free. Lamb or chicken, potatoes, vegetable, salad, bread & butter, dessert, coffee and soft drinks. Three doves available for sponsorship. Dormition Monastery Winter Dinner is Thursday, January 23 at St George. Susie Ford is our parish contact person. Our responsibility this year is beverages. Stephanie Price will set up Project Broadcast in December and go live with it at the annual meeting - this allows our church to send out text messages for news and events. Sharon Jernigan said that our Xfinity bill can perhaps be reduced and Charlie Jernigan will look into it. The parish council expressed thanks to Sharon Jernigan for her almost 50 years on parish council and many of those as chairperson. The parish council also expressed thanks to Susie Ford as she concludes her term and her service as treasurer.
