Holy Communion—for Orthodox Christians, please note that there are specific disciplines regarding receiving Communion — fasting from midnight (unless you need to take medication) and recent Confession. If you are an Orthodox Christian from another parish who has prepared in accordance with your discipline, and have a blessing from your home priest to do so, we invite and encourage you to partake of Holy Communion

For our visitors who are not Orthodox Christian: we welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. The Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (antidoron) which will be given when coming forward to receive the final blessing from the priest at the conclusion of the Liturgy. **Again, welcome!**

Reading the Scriptures of the day during the Great Fast and the hymns from the Triodion leads us along the journey to Pascha.

13th Annual Dormition Dinner from Father Michael Bassett:

I would like to thank each and every one of you for the fabulous job you did in leading each of your parishes toward a successful Pan-Orthodox gathering last Thursday. You each make it look so easy but, without question, it is clear that you put forth a lot of time and effort in preparing, shopping, setting up, tearing down, coordinating volunteers, promoting the event, etc! Forgive me for not helping you more! Here are the counts (a record year)!

- 174 registered for dinner (we are estimating perhaps 165 actually showed up); livestream: 36 unique views for Vespers and 60 unique views for the Panel Discussion
- 22 made a donation but did not attend
- Total \$ raised for the Monastery:
 - \$11,014 (subject to final double count) about half of this was raised online and a very special contribution of over \$1,600 was made by a very special friend of the monastery as a result of his Men's Ministry activities for the past year
 - \$1,949 Gift Shop Sales

This was a record for a live event for the Winter Dinner (in 2021, the first Virtual Only event, we did have 400 views and raised over \$14,000).

God brought all of this about through the hands, thoughts and prayers of many! Thank you again for your love for the Monastery - for OUR Monastery!
