SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2025 TONE 8 Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee/ [Beginning of the Lenten Triodion]/ Leavetaking of the Meeting of the Lord

"Lord I Call..." Tone 8

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear me!</u> <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord! Lord, I call up<u>on</u> You, <u>hear me!</u> Receive the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> up<u>on</u> You!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord! Let my <u>prayer</u> arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and let the lifting <u>up</u> of <u>my</u> hands be an evening <u>sac</u>rifice!// Hear <u>me</u>, O Lord!

Reader reads the rest of Psalm 140 and Psalm 141 in the pew book, then STICHERA:

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 8** We <u>off</u>er to <u>You</u>, O Christ, / our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, / for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us//by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (9) *The righteous will surround me; for You will deal bountifully with me.* Lord, <u>Lord</u>, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! / For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (8) *Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!* Rejoice, O holy <u>Si</u>on: / Mother of the churches, the abode of God, / for you were the first to receive remission of sins//by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications! The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Fa</u>ther, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has <u>saved</u> mortal man// by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with You.

Tone 1*Idiomela(from the Lenten Triodion)Brothers, let us not pray like the Pharisee!He who exalts himself will be humbled.Let us prepare to abase ourselves by fasting;let us cry aloud with the voice of the Publican://"O God, forgive us sinners!"

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.
<u>Broth</u>ers, let us not pray like the <u>Phar</u>isee!
He who exalts himself will be <u>hum</u>bled.
Let us pre<u>pare</u> to abase ourselves by <u>fast</u>ing;
let us cry aloud with the <u>voice</u> of the <u>Pub</u>lican:// "O God, forgive us <u>sin</u>ners!"

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! The <u>Phar</u>isee went up to the temple with a proud and <u>emp</u>ty heart; the Publican bowed himself in repentance. They <u>both</u> stood before You, O <u>Mas</u>ter: the one, through <u>boast</u>ing, <u>lost</u> his reward, but the <u>oth</u>er, with tears and sighs, won Your <u>bless</u>ing: Strengthen me, O Christ our God, as I weep in Your <u>pres</u>ence,// since You are the Lover of man!

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities. Tone 1 Idiomela (for the Feast, by Patriarch Germanus)
Simeon, tell us, Whom you bear in your arms, that you rejoice so greatly in the Temple? To Whom do you shout and cry aloud: "Now I am set free, for I have seen my Savior?"
This is <u>He</u> Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u>; this is God the Word, Who came forth from God, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man.//

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples! Simeon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in <u>darkness</u>, granting the Law on <u>Si</u>nai, now that <u>He</u> has become a Babe <u>subj</u>ect to the Law! This is <u>He</u> Who <u>spoke</u> through the Law. This is <u>He</u>, of Whom the <u>Proph</u>ets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has <u>saved man.//</u> Let us worship Him!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever. <u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with divine songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Sim</u>eon saw! This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>Dav</u>id announced; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us worship Him! Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 8** (from the Lenten Triodion) I know the value of tears, O almighty Lord: they delivered Hezekiah from the <u>gates</u> of death, and rescued the <u>har</u>lot from re<u>peat</u>ed sins. Tears justified the Publican instead of the <u>Phar</u>isee. I <u>pray</u> You, O Lord:// "Number me with the former, and have <u>mer</u>cy on me!"

Amen. **Tone 6** (*Theotokion – Feast*) Let the gate of heaven be <u>opened today</u>, for the unoriginate Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther has made a beginning in time without forsaking His di<u>vin</u>ity. As a Babe <u>for</u>ty days old, of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His <u>Mother</u>, as an offering in the <u>Tem</u>ple of the Law. The Elder re<u>ceives</u> Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his <u>Mas</u>ter: "Set me free for my eyes have seen your Sal<u>va</u>tion!"// Glory to You, O Lord, for You have come into the world to save mankind.

LITY

Tone 1 The <u>An</u>cient of Days, Who gave Moses the Law on Sinai in <u>for</u>mer times, today ap<u>pears</u> as a Child. As <u>Maker of the Law, He fulfills</u> the Law. He is brought into the <u>Temple accord</u>ing to the Law, and given <u>over to the Elder</u>. Simeon the righteous receives Him. Beholding the fulfillment of the divine order now <u>brought</u> to pass, rejoicing aloud, he cries: "My <u>eyes</u> have seen the Mystery hidden from the <u>ages</u> made manifest in these <u>latter days</u>, the <u>Light</u> that disperses the foolishness of the faithless <u>Gen</u>tiles, and the Glory of the newly-<u>cho</u>sen <u>Is</u>rael! <u>There</u>fore set free your servant from the <u>bonds</u> of this flesh to the life filled with wonder that knows no <u>age</u> or end,// for You grant the world great <u>mercy</u>!"

(More festal stichera may be sung if desired)

Tone 3(from the Lenten Triodion)Let us, the faithful, flee the boastfulness of the Pharisee;let us repeat in reverence the Publican's prayer:May our thoughts not be poisoned by pride, O Lord;grant us the grace to cry aloud from the depths of our hearts://"O God, be merciful to us sinners!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 3** *(from the Lenten Triodion)* Now that you see the <u>difference</u>, O my soul, between the Pharisee and the <u>Pub</u>lican, flee from the vainglory of such a <u>braggart;</u> emulate instead the prayer of repentance, <u>cry</u>ing aloud:// "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner!"

Amen. **Tone 5** (for the Feast, by Germanos or Anatolius) The <u>An</u>cient of Days, as a <u>Child</u> in the flesh, is brought by His Mother the Virgin into the Holy <u>Tem</u>ple, ful<u>fill</u>ing the promise an<u>nounced</u> by His own Law. Re<u>ceiv</u>ing Him, <u>Si</u>meon said: "Now set free your servant in peace, acc<u>ord</u>ing to your word,// for my eyes have <u>seen</u> your sal<u>va</u>tion, O Lord!"

APOSTICHA

Tone 8(for the Resurrection)Descending from heaven to ascend the Cross,
the eternal Life has come for death
to raise those who are fallen;
to enlighten those in darkness.//
O Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, glory to You!

V. *The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!* We <u>glo</u>rify Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from <u>suf</u>fering. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>rup</u>tion in the tomb.// He is the Redeemer of our souls.

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved. In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tor</u>tures of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mer</u>cy. V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore! O<u>Mas</u>ter of all, incomprehensible Creator of <u>heav</u>en and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained <u>pas</u>sionlessness for me. Accepting burial and a<u>ris</u>ing in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your al<u>mighty</u> hand. Glory to Your rising on the <u>third</u> day! By it You have granted us eternal <u>life</u> and <u>cleans</u>ing of sins// as the only com<u>pas</u>sionate One.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 5** *(from the Lenten Triodion)* The <u>weight</u> of my transgressions <u>bur</u>dens mine eyes: I cannot lift my gaze to the heights of <u>heaven</u>, O Lord. Ac<u>cept</u> me in repentance, as You accepted the <u>Pub</u>lican;// have mercy on <u>me</u>, O <u>Sav</u>ior!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 8** *(for the Feast, by Andrew of Crete)* He Who is borne on high by the Cherubim and praised in hymns by the Seraphim is brought today according to the Law into the holy Temple and rests in the arms of the Elder as on a throne. From Joseph He receives gifts fitting for God: a pair of doves, a symbol of the spotless Church and of the newly chosen people of the Gentiles, and two young pigeons, for He is the originator of the two <u>Cov</u>enants, both <u>Old</u> and New. Simeon, now granted the fulfillment of the prophesies concerning himself, blesses the Virgin and Theotokos <u>Mary</u>. He foretells in figures the Passion of her Son. From Him he begs release, crying aloud: "Now, Master, set me free as You have promised me, for I have <u>seen</u> the pre-e<u>ter</u>nal Light// and the Lord and Savior of the people who bear the Name of Christ!"

TROPARIA

Tone 8 You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suf</u>ferings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rection</u>, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 1** Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, <u>Full</u> of Grace! From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, <u>Christ</u> our God, enlightening those who sat in <u>darkness</u>. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous <u>Eld</u>er, you accepted in your arms the <u>Redeemer</u> of our souls,// Who grants us the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

(at the Divine Liturgy)

Deacon: Wisdom! Upright!

Priest: The Lord has named known his Salvation, before all the nations he has revealed his Righteousness. Son of God, risen from the dead, save us who sing to you: Alleluia!

Tone 8Troparion (Resurrection)You descended from on high, O Merciful One!You accepted the three day burial to free us from our sufferings!//O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to You!

Tone 1Troparion (Feast)Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, Full of Grace!From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, ^Christ our God,enlightening those who sat in darkness.Rejoice and be glad, O righteous Elder,you accepted in your arms the ^Redeemer of our souls,//Who grants us the Resurrection!

(saint or feast of the temple)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 1** Kontakion (Feast) By Your Na<u>tiv</u>ity You sanctified the <u>Virg</u>in's womb and blessed Simeon's hands, ^O <u>Christ</u> God. Now You have come and saved <u>us</u> through love. Grant <u>peace</u> to all Orthodox <u>Christ</u>ians,// O only Lover of Man!

Tone 8Prokeimenon(Resurrection)

Pray and make your vows / before the Lord, our God! (Ps. 75:10a)

V. In Judah God is known; His Name is great in Israel. (Ps. 75:1)

Epistle (296) 2 Timothy 3:10-15

Tone 8 Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

V. Come, let us rejoice in the Lord! Let us make a joyful noise to God our Savior! (*Ps.* 94:1)

V. Let us come before His face with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise! (Ps. 94:2)

Gospel (89) Luke 18:10-14

(*Instead of "It is truly meet…," we sing:*) **Tone 3** O Virgin Theotokos, hope of all Christians, protect, preserve, and save those who hope in you!

In the shadow and letter of the Law, let us the faithful discern a figure: every male [child] that opens the womb is holy to God. Therefore we magnify the firstborn Word of the Father Who has no beginning,// the Son firstborn of a Mother who had not known man.
