Gabriel, founder of Lesnovo Monastery in Bulgaria (11th c.) Ven. Paul of Thebes (341) and John Calabytes (“the Hut-dweller”—5th c.). Ven. Pansophius of Alexandria, Martyr (ca. 249-251).

TROPARIA

Tone 6 The Angelic Powers were at Your tomb; / the guards became as dead men. / Mary stood by Your grave, / seeking Your most pure body. / You captured hell, not being tempted by it. / You came to the Virgin, granting life. / O Lord, Who rose from the dead, // glory to You.

Tone 4 O God of our Fathers who ever deals with us according to Your tender compassion, withdraw not Your mercy from us, but by the intercessions of our Fathers Gabriel and Prochorus direct our lives in peace.

KONTAKION

Tone 1 By Your Nativity You sanctified the Virgin's womb! And blessed Simeon's hands, O Christ God. Now You have come and saved us through love. Grant peace to all Orthodox Christians, O only Lover of Man!

The prokeimenon in the seventh tone: Let the saints exult in glory, / let them sing for joy on their couches! (Psalm 149:5)

v. Sing to the Lord a new song, His praise in the assembly of the faithful! (Psalm 149:1)

THE READING FROM THE EPISTLE OF THE APOSTLE PAUL TO THE GALATIANS (5:22-6:2) *Brethren:* the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. Let us have no self-conceit, no provoking of one another, no envy of one another. Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Look to yourself, lest you too be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE (17:12-19) At that time as Jesus entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.” When he saw them he said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus, “Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?” And he said to him, “Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.”

The holy Gospel according to John 20:19-31 (9th Matins Gospel)

Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, “Peace be with you.” When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.” And when He had said this, He breathed

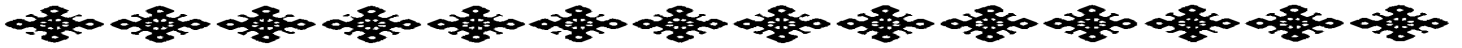
on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained. Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said to him, "We have seen the Lord." So he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." And after eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus came, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, "Peace to you!" Then He said to Thomas, "Reach your finger here, and look at My hands; and reach your hand here, and put it into My side. Do not be unbelieving, but believing." And Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Thomas, because you have seen Me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.

Saint Prochorus of Pshina (January 15) pursued asceticism in the Bransk wilderness at the River Pshina, and he founded a monastery there. He is renowned as one of the great ascetics of monastic life. He died at the end of the tenth century. Miracles occurred from the saint's relics. According to the Serbian Chronicles, the pious King Milutin (1276-1320) built a church in honor of Saint Prochorus.

Saint Gabriel of Lesnovo (January 15), founder of the Lesnov monastery near the city of Kratov. Receiving a large inheritance after the death of his parents, he rejected marriage and became a monk on a mountain at Lesnov. There he built a church in the name of the Archangel Michael, and gathered many monks around him. He appointed an igumen, and left all his inheritance to the monastery. He then hid himself in a mine, where he lived in asceticism for thirty years, conquering demonic temptations through prayer and fasting.

He then returned to the Lesnov monastery and ended his life in peace. After thirty years, his relics were uncovered, and healings worked through them. Long afterwards, they were transferred to Trnovo [Tirnova] in Bulgaria. *from oca.org*

From the parish bylaws: "A quorum for membership meetings shall consist of 25 per cent of the total number of members in good standing on record...If at a time fixed for the meeting; the present parish members should fail to constitute the required quorum, another membership meeting shall be convened one hour later on the same day which meeting shall be considered valid in the presence of any number of attending members. This provision should be included in the text of the notice convening the general membership meeting."

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE **Election of parish council officers** - those elected are Sharon Jernigan, president; Paul Brayan, vice-president; Ellyn Serra, secretary; Susie Ford, treasurer; Stephanie Price, non-officer for the executive committee. **Finances** - the balance sheet of all the church accounts (excluding the endowment fund) ended 2022 with \$173,822.77. We ended 2021 with \$140,396.66. **Rector's report** - a flier will be coming out with the schedule for lenten services. Lenten retreat will be hosted by our church on Saturday, March 18 with Archbishop Alexander and, tentatively, Bishop Anthony (Antiochian) each giving one talk. **Church School** - classes resume on January 15. **Fundraising** - *Theophany banquet* 84 dinners, profit was \$750 that is being earmarked for maintenance. *Meatfare dinner* is Sunday, February 19; *Cheesefare dinner* is Sunday, February 26. **Charity** - The North End Soup kitchen will be February 2 from 9 to 12:30 pm. \$952 was collected in December for the OCA Diocese of Alaska. God bless everyone for their generosity. **Maintenance** - a new clothes hanger was put in the back closet for vestments. The sensor in the men's bathroom went out so it was replaced. Outdoor light was added on the northwest corner, another will be added in the southwest corner. The lock on the door going into the narthex was repaired. The light in the courtyard was replaced. Anyone who would like to purchase the old television set that was in the hall, please contact the office and make an offer. Some gravestones were knocked over and the plan is to set them upright in the spring. **New Business** - website has been updated by Stephanie Price and Ellyn Serra. **Community activities** - Stephanie Price wants to plan social activities *including members of our local community* such as game nights, egg hunt, etc. Saturday, February 4 have a game night.
