SUNDAY, JANUARY 19, 2025 30th Sunday after Pentecost / Ven. Macarius the Great of Egypt

"Lord I Call..." Tone 5

Lord, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! <u>Hear</u> me, O Lord! <u>Lord</u>, I call upon You, <u>hear</u> me! Re<u>ceive</u> the <u>voice</u> of my prayer, when I <u>call</u> upon You!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Let my prayer arise in Your sight as <u>in</u>cense, and <u>let</u> the lifting <u>up</u> of my hands be an <u>evening sac</u>rifice!// <u>Hear me</u>, O Lord!

Reader reads the rest of Psalm 140 and Psalm 141 in the pew book, then STICHERA:

V. (10) Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to Your Name! **Tone 5** By Your <u>pre</u>cious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, / You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. / By Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin / and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O <u>on</u>ly be<u>got</u>ten One.

V. (9) *The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.* <u>Christ</u> was led as a sheep to the <u>slaughter</u> / in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>human race.</u>/ The <u>princes of hell were frightened by this,</u> / for the <u>gates</u> of sorrow were <u>lifted.</u> / Christ the King of glory had <u>entered</u>, / <u>say</u>ing to those in <u>chains</u>: "Go forth!"// And to those in <u>darkness</u>: "<u>Come</u> to the light!"

V. (8) *Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!* O great wonder! / The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man / and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mortal.</u> / <u>Come</u>, O sons of <u>nations</u>, / let us <u>worship Him</u>, / for de<u>liv</u>ered from error by His com<u>pas</u>sion,// we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Per</u>sons!

V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

We <u>offer</u> You our evening <u>wor</u>ship, / O never <u>set</u>ting Light, / Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh; / Who <u>even</u> descended to hell to dispel its <u>darkness</u>. / Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>nations</u>.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Giv</u>er of light!

V. (6) If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But there is forgiveness with *You*.

We <u>glo</u>rify the Leader of our sal<u>va</u>tion; / by His Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead, / the <u>world</u> was <u>saved</u> from deceit. / The as<u>sem</u>bly of Angels rejoices / as the deceit of demons is <u>ov</u>erthrown.// Fallen Adam <u>rises</u> as the <u>dev</u>il falls.

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.
The guards were instructed by the lawless ones:
"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:
'The body was stolen from the tomb while we were asleep.'"
But who has heard of a body being stolen,
a body embalmed and naked,
with its grave clothes left behind in the tomb?
Do not be deceived, O Jews,
study the words of the Prophets and understand://
Christ is the Redeemer of the world and all powerful!

V. (4) From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch, let Israel hope on the Lord! Tone 4 (for Ven. Macarius) (You have given a sign)
Desiring blessedness that passes understanding, you took abstinence for luxury, O inspired one, poverty for wealth, lack of possessions as true abundance and humility for glory.
As you intended, you reached your heart's desire, O Macarius,// and now you dwell in the mansions of the saints.

V. (3) For with the Lord there is mercy and with Him is plenteous redemption, and He will deliver Israel from all his iniquities.

Desiring blessedness that passes under<u>stand</u>ing, you took abstinence for luxury, O in<u>spired</u> one, <u>pov</u>erty for wealth, lack of possessions as true a<u>bund</u>ance and humility for <u>glo</u>ry. As you intended, you reached your heart's de<u>sire</u>, O Ma<u>car</u>ius,// and now you dwell in the <u>man</u>sions of the saints.

V. (2) Praise the Lord, all nations! Praise Him, all peoples!

You completed the course of ascetic life without <u>wavering</u>, / and you kept the faith, O <u>Fa</u>ther. / Thus you <u>gained</u> a crown of righteousness pre<u>pared</u> for you by Christ, / Who grants the prizes of <u>vic</u>tory / and bestows the gifts and re<u>wards</u> of <u>la</u>bors.// Pray now, O God-bearer, that we also may <u>run</u> this course!

V. (1) For His mercy is confirmed on us, and the truth of the Lord endures forever. You denied yourself every pleasure, O divinely-<u>wise</u> one; you pummeled your body and embittered your <u>sens</u>es through <u>labors</u> of hardship and <u>ab</u>stinence, through long-suffering in temptations and patience in ad<u>ver</u>sities. In their place you have re<u>ceived</u> un<u>end</u>ing joy,// everlasting delight and ineffable <u>glo</u>ry. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 8** (for Ven. Macarius) Rejoice, O Egypt! You brought forth a great protector, Macarius the <u>bless</u>ed, who shone with the wisdom of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, transcending all asceticism with his virtuous <u>way</u> of life. We offer him as mediator, be<u>seeching him</u>// that he may intercede with Christ for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 5** (Theotokion – Dogmatikon) In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,// O Lord, have mercy on us!

APOSTICHA

Tone 5 We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise, O incarnate Christ and <u>Savior</u>. By ac<u>cepting</u> the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake, as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man, You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,// and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>sav</u>ing our souls.

V. *The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty!* By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lov</u>er of man, You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>va</u>tion for all. By ac<u>cept</u>ing death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity. You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glo</u>ry, as God.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man!

V. For He has established the world, so that it shall never be moved. Your cruci<u>fix</u>ion and descent into hell are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man. You have captured it, releasing the ancient <u>pris</u>oners. You have <u>opened Paradise and giv</u>en it to us. <u>Grant</u> us purifi<u>ca</u>tion of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise//and save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man! V. Holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore! For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and re<u>store</u> us from our evil trans<u>gres</u>sions;// and <u>save</u> us, O Lover of man!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; **Tone 6** (Ven. Macarius) The sound of your teachings has gone out into <u>all</u> the earth, O venerable Father Ma<u>car</u>ius. Therefore you have found the reward of your labors in the <u>heav</u>ens. You destroyed the hosts of <u>de</u>mons and reached the ranks of Angels, whose life you blamelessly <u>fol</u>lowed. Since you boldness before <u>Christ</u> our God,// entreat <u>peace</u> for our souls!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. **Tone 6** (Theotokion) My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of you, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>an</u>cient curse. Unceasingly we magnify you as the <u>Mother of God!</u> Rejoice, O ce<u>les</u>tial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>La</u>dy:// the Protection, Intercession and Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

Tone 5 Let <u>us</u>, the faithful, praise and <u>wor</u>ship the Word, / co-eternal with the Father and the <u>Spirit</u>, / <u>born</u> for our salvation from the <u>Virgin</u>; / for He <u>willed</u> to be lifted up on the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh, / to en<u>dure</u> death, / and to <u>raise</u> the dead// by His <u>glo</u>rious Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, **Tone 1 Troparion** *(Ven. Macarius)* O <u>dwell</u>er of the wilderness and angel in the <u>body</u>, / you were a wonderworker, O our God-bearing Father Ma<u>car</u>ius. / You re<u>ceived</u> heavenly gifts through fasting, vigil and <u>prayer</u>, / healing the sick and the souls of those <u>drawn</u> to you by faith. / <u>Glory</u> to Him Who gave you <u>strength</u>! / Glory to Him Who granted you a <u>crown</u>!//Glory to Him Who grants <u>heal</u>ing to all!

Amen. **Tone 1 Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion** When <u>Ga</u>briel announced to you, O Virgin, saying "Rejoice!" with that word the Master of all was incarnate in <u>you</u>, the holy Ark, spoken of by the righteous <u>Da</u>vid! Your <u>womb</u> became more spacious than the <u>heavens</u>, for you carried your Cre<u>a</u>tor. <u>Glo</u>ry to Him Who took a<u>bode</u> in you!
