## JULY 2021

### SAINT ROMANOS THE MELODIST from his kontakion, *on Pentecost*

#### *Stanza 5*

On hearing this [Peter's words], those who had been called with him gathered themselves at once like lambs to a shepherd, charmed by his word, and silently they articulated what they longed for and made intense supplications to the Almighty, which contained these words, "To you the Governor and King of the angels, to the Suzerain and Creator of mortals, to you, the One who by his mere nod holds sway over things on earth and sea, your friends and servants cry aloud, 'Swiftly send us the All-Holy Spirit.'"

#### *Stanza 6*

As soon as they had completed their supplications, they signed them, having sealed them with faith and sent them on high. Their Teacher read them and said, "Of your own free will, O Paraclete, under no order, but as you wish, descend. For the disciples whom I gathered for you and the Father, await you, the ones whom I instructed when I said, 'Make disciples of the nations proclaiming the Father, honouring the Son and praising the All-Holy Spirit.'"

#### *Stanza 7*

Then God the Paraclete heeded those who implored him and took hold of them as they prayed. Yet the ineffable in no way changed his place, for condescension did not become alteration, nor did he suffer diminution, for he was on high and he was below and everywhere. For divine nature is ineffable and intangible. He is not seen with eyes, but he is known by faith. He is not grasped by hands, but he is handled by the hearts of believers, the All-Holy Spirit.

## FROM FATHER'S DESK

On July 20 we remember the holy prophet Elias (Elijah). We read of him in the books of 1 and 2 Kings in the Old Testament. The prophet was taken up into heaven by a fiery chariot, as witnessed by his disciple, Elisseos (Elisha) [2 Kings 2:1-12]. On Mount Carmel, Elias stood before the priests of the pagan god Ba'al to whom Israel had turned to worship: "Then Elias said to all the people, 'Come near to me'; and all the people came near to him. And he repaired the altar of the LORD that had been thrown down; Elias took twelve stones, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of Jacob, to whom the word of the LORD came, saying, 'Israel shall be your name'; and with the stones he built an altar in the name of the LORD. And he made a trench about the altar, as great as would contain two measures of seed. And he put the wood in order, and cut the bull in pieces and laid it on the wood. And he said, 'Fill four jars with water, and pour it on the burnt offering, and on the wood.' And he said, 'Do it a second time'; and they did it a second time. And he said, 'Do it a third time'; and they did it a third time. And the water ran round about the altar, and filled the trench also with water. And at the time of the offering of the oblation, Elias the prophet came near and said, 'O LORD, God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, let it be known this day that you are God in Israel, and that I am your servant, and that I have done all these things at your word. Answer me, O LORD, answer me, that this people may know that you, O LORD, are God, and that you have turned their hearts back.' Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the burnt offering, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench." (1 Kings 18:30-38) On Mount Horeb, the Son of God manifested himself to Elias as a small quiet voice (1 Kings 19:8-13).

These two revelations of the Lord came to Elias on mountains. In the Scriptures we hear of many of the "mountains of God" where the glory of God's presence is revealed: Mount Sinai wrapped in smoke because the Son of God, the Glory, descended upon it in fire (as the altar is surrounded by the sweet smoke of incense); Mount Sion where the Temple was built; Mount Tabor where the human flesh of Messiah Jesus shone with the radiance of his divine nature; the hill of Golgotha where Messiah Jesus offered himself as a sacrifice.

We, also, ascend the mountains of God in our ascent into the temple. We ascend to enter the church to come before the high place which is the holy altar. The one same eucharistic table is at once Sinai, Carmel, Horeb, Tabor, Golgotha, the Holy of Holies, the upper room, and the heavenly sanctuary. The altar is all these mountains of God where God has revealed himself to us. We ascend to come into this holy temple. We ascend in our worship, we ascend to heaven even as heaven bends down to receive us. In our ascent we leave behind the worries of life as we come to receive the King of all invisibly escorted by the ranks of angels. We ascend all the way to heaven in the divine Liturgy as we stand (and that is significant, we stand - the best posture of worship - because the angels stand) before the highest of high places, God's throne. The innermost part of the altar is called the high place, it is where there is set a throne, a place where only the bishop sits as he images God on his throne at the divine Liturgy.

We ascend to the heights and our Father gives to us by the Holy Spirit the bread and wine now become the very body and blood of the Son of God made man - our food and drink so that we be changed into him, so that we become god, little "c" Christs, so that we ascend from our self-will, our passions, our sins and are carried up to His throne.

We will descend back to earth as we leave the temple so that God present in us shines in the world. As Elder Aimilianos said: "[The Liturgy] takes us into His kingdom. Then we will depart again to go to our houses with our passions, our sins, our fallenness. It doesn't matter! We will again go to the Liturgy, we will grab Christ again, He will deify us again."

"We will again enter His house, all the way into the intimacy of His kitchen and dining room, bring Him His own gifts, the wine and the bread, into which we put and pour our misery, our fallenness, our pain, our despair, only to lift them up to His altar and only to have them transformed into His body and blood. We pour ourselves into the chalice only to be given back Him Himself. We put our fallenness on the diskos, only to have it changed into His being. We give Him us, being still a gift of His own, to be given back Him. This is our hope, our certainty, which no one can take from us!" ([apriestoftheorthodoxchurch](#)) Let us continue, especially every Sunday, to make our ascent to the throne of Messiah Jesus where he reigns with the Father and the Spirit.

**PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE** COUNCIL met on Tuesday June 8<sup>th</sup> in person. The parish finances remain stable. God bless everyone for their stewardship during this challenging time. There were many donations for the rummage sale (June 11-12) with set up on June 10 and clean-up on June 14. The shrine feast Liturgy and parish picnic are scheduled for August 22. A second coat of paint needs to be applied to the picnic tables. Some of the plywood panels in the pavilion need to be replaced but because of the current cost of lumber that has been deferred. In the meantime they were painted by Dennis Jernigan. The painting of the church is continuing. Discussion took place about continuing livestreaming of the divine services. The other parishes in the area are continuing livestreaming on weekends and so will our parish. Stephanie Price spoke of increasing the social media presence for the parish so that those who do not know about the Orthodox faith may find out about it through our parish. The annual Parish Development Forum, co-sponsored by our diocese, will take place virtually on July 16. Susie Ford is our diocesan representative to the Forum replacing diocesan chancellor, Fr Andrew Jarmus. Topics will be organized into three important content tracks - 'Personal Spiritual Resiliency', 'The Resilient Parish' and 'Becoming Fishers of Men'.




