V. (9) The righteous will surround me, for You will deal bountifully with me.

Christ was led as a sheep to the slaughter

in order to grant Resurrection to the <u>hu</u>man race.

The princes of hell were frightened by this,

for the gates of sorrow were <u>lift</u>ed.

Christ the King of glory had entered,

saying to those in chains: "Go forth!"//

And to those in darkness: "Come to the light!"

- V. (8) Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice!
- O great wonder! / The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man / and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mor</u>tal. / <u>Come</u>, O sons of <u>nations</u>, / let us <u>wor</u>ship Him, / for de<u>livered</u> from error by His compassion, / / we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Persons!</u>
  - V. (7) Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications!

V. (5) For Your Name's sake I wait for You, O Lord. My soul has waited for Your word; my soul has hoped on the Lord.

"Hide the rising of Christ, take money and say:

'The body was stolen from the tomb while we were asleep.'"

But who has heard of a body being stolen,
