CATECHETICAL SERMON of our father among the saints JOHN THE GOLDEN-MOUTH

on the Holy and Great Sunday of Pascha

If any are pious and God-loving, let them enjoy this beautiful and bright feast. If any are grateful servants, let them enter rejoicing into the joy of their Lord. If any have labored fasting, let them now take their wage. If any have worked since the first hour, let them accept today their right due. If any have come after the third hour, let them feast gratefully. If any have arrived after the sixth hour, let them not hesitate at all, for nothing is lost. If any have come after the ninth hour, let them come forth doubting nothing. If any have arrived only for the eleventh hour, let them not fear their lateness, for the Master, being generous, receives the last even as the first; he gives rest to the one from the eleventh hour even as to the one who has worked from the first; he both has pity on the last and takes care of the first; he both gives to this one and grants to the other; he both receives the works and embraces the thought; and the action he honors, and the intention he praises.

Therefore enter all of you into the joy of our Lord, the first and the last accept your reward. Rich and poor dance with each other. Abstinent and slothful honor the day. Fasters and non-fasters rejoice today. The table is full, all partake sumptuously. The calf is large, let no one leave hungry. All enjoy the banquet of the faith! All enjoy the fullness of the goodness. Let no one bewail poverty, for the kingdom of all has been revealed. Let no one grieve faults, for forgiveness has risen from the tomb. Let no one fear death, for the death of the savior has freed us. Being taken by it, he quenched it. He who descended into hell has despoiled hell. He embittered it when it tasted his flesh.

And Isaias, proclaiming this, cried out, ‘Hell’, he said, ‘was embittered meeting you below’. It was embittered, for it was abolished. It was embittered, for it was mocked. It was embittered, for it was killed. It was embittered, for it was destroyed. It was embittered, for it was bound fast. It took a body, and came upon God. It took earth, and met heaven. It took what it saw, and fell on account of what it did not see. Death, where is your sting? Hell, where is your victory? Christ is risen and you are overthrown! Christ is risen and the demons have fallen! Christ is risen and angels rejoice! Christ is risen and life reigns! Christ is risen and there is no dead in the tomb! For Christ, being raised from the dead, has become the first fruits of the fallen asleep. To him be glory and dominion to the ages of ages. Amen.

FROM FATHER'S DESK

Dear faithful and friends of St. Nicholas,

Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

Throughout the season of Pascha we exchange greetings with, "Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!" It is a joy-filled greeting and it is also a profession of our faith. It began at the empty tomb of our Lord Jesus when the angel told the women, "He has risen; He is not here!" (Mark 16:6) Since that time on that morning of Pascha these words of salvation have been preached, that the Lord is risen indeed. (cf. Luke 24:34)

But even from that day of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus there has been doubt about the reality Christ's rising from the dead. On the day of His resurrection our Lord Jesus Christ appeared in the evening to His apostles. But Thomas was not there. When the other disciples told him, in essence, "Christ is risen!" his response was not "Indeed, the Lord is risen!" Thomas said words akin to "I'll believe it when I see it." He doubted. And to this day we use the phrase "doubting Thomas" for someone who is skeptical of a truth.

It took our Lord Jesus coming again, when Thomas was present, to undo Thomas' skepticism. Our Lord Jesus showed Thomas the wound in His side, the nail marks in His hands. He told Thomas, "do not be faithless but believing." (John 20:27) Thomas' heart melted. He could not doubt his own senses that it was indeed Jesus who stood before him, not merely revived from death but resurrected: His body glorified yet showing the marks of His crucifixion. Thomas cried out, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28) Finally he let himself believe that it was true. He let himself believe now that his fellow disciples weren't deluded, that His and their and our Lord and Master and friend is risen from the dead, never to die again, raised up to life in His glorified human body.

We ourselves may have moments of weakness, when our belief is tested. When we may struggle to say or live the words, "Indeed He is risen!" When we experience the death of a loved one we may feel that "their departure ... (is) an affliction, and their going from us to be their destruction." (Wisdom 3:2-3) We wonder what lies beyond this life. No one has come to tell us. What we know we know from the testimony found in Sacred Scripture, in the writings and lives of the saints, holy people we know.

These all have their foundation stone in the words of our Lord Jesus Christ Who is the Truth and is the first among all those who have died to be resurrected from the dead. He has told us that "those who have done good, (will come forth) to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment." (John 5:29) To Lazarus' sister Martha, Jesus said, "I am the Resurrection and the Life; he who believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die." (John 11:25-26)

And our Lord Jesus asks us, "Do you believe this?" (John 11:26) Do we believe that our Lord Jesus Christ is the resurrection and life? That He is risen from the dead and that all who die believing in Him pass from death to life? We are asked at baptism, "Do you believe in Christ?" That is, do we believe in the risen Christ? It is a crucial question for us throughout the whole of our lives. We say "Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!" These words are a simple but direct and powerful confession of our faith. When we say these words we must speak from our heart and not merely our lips. Christ is risen from the dead and "in Christ shall all be made alive." (1 Corinthians 15:22) Do we believe this? In all the moments of our life, of sadness and of joy, of struggle and of peace, we can find salvation only if in the deeps of our heart we believe that Christ is risen, truly He is risen!



THE DAY WITHOUT EVENING

Pascha is the inauguration of a new age. It reveals the mystery of the eighth day. It is our taste, in this age, of the new and unending day of the Kingdom of God. Something of this new and unending day is conveyed to us in the length of the paschal services, in the repetition of the paschal order for all the services of Bright Week, and in the special paschal features retained in the services for the forty days until Ascension. Forty days are, as it were, treated as one day. Together they comprise the symbol of the new time in which the Church lives and toward which she ever draws the faithful, from one degree of glory to another. "O Christ, great and most holy Pascha. O Wisdom, Word and Power of God, grant that we may more perfectly partake of You in the never-ending day of Your kingdom." (Ninth Ode, Paschal Canon).

ELDER AIMILIANOS OF SIMONOPETRA - We must realize the following truth: in order to begin to live a spiritual life, I must be vividly conscious of the fact that I am nothing, that I can do nothing, and that I am completely incapable and unworthy. It is only the *right hand* of the Most High, only God's grace and power that can produce fruit in my spiritual life. Here we think of the words of Saint Symeon the New Theologian: "It is only when I lament and despair that He shows Himself and He looks at me, He who contemplates all creatures". When I have accepted the fact that I can do nothing, when all seems lost, then God visits me, and it is then that I see Him. And what is the result? Life becomes a vision, a delight, and a fulfillment. In the words of the Divine Liturgy of Saint Basil: "We have been filled with Your life that knows no end. We have feasted gladly on Your inexhaustible nourishment". We are filled with life eternal. We feast on the food of heaven. But this food is not available to people who think they are something, or that they can accomplish things without God. God cannot commune with people who think like that. Why? Because communion with God is contemplation, a vision of God, given to us by God Himself. It is with this in mind that Saint John Chrysostom prays in his Divine Liturgy: "Fill our hearts with joy and gladness, O You who fulfilled the entire plan of the Father". And Sacred Scripture says *rejoice in your youth* (Ecclesiastes 11:9); and *gladness of the heart is the life of man* (Sirach 30:22). But the world understands these things differently. *Psalms and the Life of Faith, Psalm 63, pp 21-22*
