If you are an Orthodox Christian from another parish who has prepared in accordance with your discipline, and have a blessing from your home priest to do so, we invite and encourage you to partake of Holy Communion

For our visitors who are not Orthodox Christian: we welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. The Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (antidoron) which will be given when coming forward to receive the final blessing from the priest at the conclusion of the Liturgy. **Again, welcome!**

THE READING FROM THE EPISTLE OF THE HOLY APOSTLE PAUL TO THE

GALATIANS (2:16-20) Brethren, knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is Christ therefore a minister of sin? Certainly not! 

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

financial report - statement of activity - we are \$12,000 under where we need to be. "Statement of activity" is the term used for not-for-profits rather than "profit and loss." Checks will be written against the budget. Any check over budget will be red-flagged by QuickBooks. Upcoming expenses for November 2024 \$22,942. In November 2023 income was \$14,271. Upcoming expenses for December 2024 are \$21,211. In December 2023 income was \$21,253. *endowment fund* - October loss of \$10,428.29. *rector's report* - Father Matthew updated on the "Our Diocese" phone application as a way to connect parishioners in the diocese and parishioners within a parish. Barry Cavett volunteered to worn the Our Diocese app for our parish. 7 catechumens. *youth ministry/church school* - need help with the gift bags for St Nicholas visit (December 8). Please donate money earmarked for "St Nicholas visit" as there are students with allergies and the gift bags will be prepared as allergen-free. vision meeting - Thank you to Stephanie Price for chairing the vision meeting on November 5 which will be shared with the parishioners. The plan is prior to the annual meeting to share an infographic of the vision which includes our desire for an enhanced media ministry, maintenance ministry, outreach ministry - in December and January newsletters, in Sunday bulletins, in emails. community outreach - Trunk-or-treat was very well attended. Anyone can participate and candy can be bought in bulk in advance. . fundraising - Cookie Walk is Saturday, December 14 from 10 am to 1 pm. Please spread the word, drop of fliers at business you frequent, share the event on your Facebook page, and among your friends and neighbors. Saint Nicholas visit on December 8 is lenten potluck. charity *ministries* - the Angel Tree is all ready for children's names to be taken and gifts bought for them. *maintenance* - circulating pump costs \$5,000 and two other pumps that are \$2,000 each so we have almost \$10,000 worth of commercial pumps. Bearings need to be replaced in one of the pumps. The front door to the church was repaired. Our commercial furnaces require maintenance from someone licensed to work on commercial (not residential) furnaces. Catechumen Mike Donigan will assist with the cemetery. In 2023 over \$4,300 was donated toward maintenance. In 2024 we have received \$867. Big projects for capital improvements in the coming year - furnace work, new air conditioning/heating for conference room/offices. More space has been freed up in the library for use for our catechumen/inquirers' classes. new business - annual meeting is Sunday, January 26, 2025. Start publishing announcement of annual meeting on January 5 in the Sunday bulletin. Theophany dinner on Sunday, January 12.
