## SEPTEMBER 2022

### SAINT NICHOLAS KAVASILAS

**“Our members are wholly clothed with the Saviour Himself, not like a garment which we wear or the skin with which we are born, but much more, in that this clothing is far more closely united to those who wear it than their very bones. One could amputate our members without our consent, but as for Christ, no one, human or demon, can separate Him from us. As Paul says, ‘neither things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature’ (Romans 8:38, 39), however great its power, can separate us from Him.”**

**FROM FATHER'S DESK** Beloved, I'm not sure about other languages and cultures but in English in America we like to use hyperbole - "I'm starving" when I'm not starving, what I am is *hungry*. "I love pizza." I don't *love* pizza, I *like* pizza. "Love" gets used often. It's more than a concept or abstraction or exaggeration. This brings us to Saint Paul's first letter to the Christians at Corinth (1 Corinthians 13:4-8, 13)

Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails...And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

Here Saint Paul is speaking about love not as something in theory but how love is, what love does, what it looks like in action. Remembering that Saint John in his first letter writes "God is love" (1 John 4:8, 16), His very being is Love, we can read Saint Paul this way, replacing the word "love" with "God" in each instance:

God suffers long and God is kind; God does not envy; God does not parade Himself, God is not puffed up; God does not behave rudely, God does not seek His own, God is not provoked, God thinks no evil; God does not rejoice in iniquity, but God rejoices in the Truth; God bears all things...God endures all things. God never fails.

God never fails. Saint Paul writes that of faith, hope, and love the greatest is love. Love because in the age to come being in God's presence what need is there of faith in things unseen? We see Him! What need of there is hope when He our Hope is before our eyes? There is only Love, God who for those who live His life of love, as Saint Paul wrote above, God is light, joy, and peace. For those who won't have Him but have to have Him anyway because He will be all in all, He, Love, will be as a burning flame.

Beloved, let us pray that everyone experiences God as light, joy, and peace. Let us turn to Him who is Love and live life as He is, as Christ has lived. Let us pursue Him who is Love. And know that in our pursuing Him we will discover that He has been pursuing us. As Psalm 23 puts it "His goodness and mercy hunts me down all the days of my life." He doesn't simply pursue as walking behind and following us but as the Lion of Judah who is on the hunt and will not rest until it has its prey. He will have us. And know that if our back is to Him, He never fails, He never ceases hunting us down. With His hand He works to turn us to Himself. Instead of showing Him our back by chasing after other things, let's turn 'round and see His Face so that catches us and so may we enjoy the life of Love - of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. **CANDLE PRICES** for 3 & 7-day candles will increase by \$1 effective September 1. 3-day will be \$3 and 7-day will be \$5.

**CANDLE STAND VOLUNTEERS** If you cannot be present on a Sunday, it is your responsibility to find a replacement.

- Be at the candle stand by 9:15 am on Sunday.
- Handle the cash box.
- Hand out the bulletin and announcements before Liturgy
- Bring bulletins and announcements into the fellowship hall after Liturgy
- Keep track of what type of candles are needed at the candle stand through a checklist:
  - 6 day clear glass
  - 3 day clear plastic
  - 3 day red plastic
  - beeswax tapers (these are most used)
  - white paraffin candles and cardboard drip catchers for Funeral/Parastas candles (these must be prepped in advance and put in the two baskets for these candles, Discard of the old candles and drip catchers after a Funeral/Parastas)
- help set-up for Parastas (putting in place the wheat, wine, bread on the table next to the tetrapod)

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE Barry Andrew Cavett and Philip Wiles will be received into the Church by chrismation at 10 am on Sunday, August 21, prior to the beginning of the outdoor Divine Liturgy.

Candles - With the increase in costs for candles, effective September 1, the donation for seven day candles will be \$5 and for three day candles will be \$3, these represent an increase of \$1 per candle.

Endowment fund has shown an increase since June. The fund is not back to where it was prior to the market volatility.

Church school - August 28 will be the organizing meeting for church school.

Fundraising - In fundraising the parish picnic is August 21 and the rummage sale is September 9 and 10. Donations towards the cost of the lamb will offset the cost and increase the fundraising potential. If you are able to donate towards the cost of a lamb or the whole cost of a lamb, please contact the office.

Two lambs have been donated so far and one person has made a donation towards the lamb. 72 dinner tickets have been sold as of Tuesday, August 9. Saturday, August 20 the interior of the pavilion and picnic tables will be cleaned for the picnic. Volunteers are welcome to help.

Rummage sale - we are not doing pick-up of larger items, please plan to drop off any larger items. We may look to have a bingo in the fall or after the new year.

Church building and grounds - because of the expense of pulling wires for new thermostats, we can buy a couple used air compressors to see us through the winter. The icon shrine in the courtyard will be installed for the outdoor Liturgy on August 21. Need to buy materials for filling the cracks in the seams in the parking lot.

Candle stand - a schedule of volunteers will be added to the monthly newsletter.

RUMMAGE SALE is September 9 & 10. We need your gently used donations as well as a lot of help to setup, during the sale & cleanup! Lucy Hogg is chairing the event so you can talk with her if you have questions or the sign-up sheet is in the fellowship hall. Fliers are also on the table so you can post them in the community.

**ORTHODOX WOMEN** in the Healing Ministries 29th Annual Retreat is September 30 & October 1, 2022. V. Rev. Paul Jannakos will be speaking on "How to Pray". Fr. Paul received a degree in Music before earning his M.Div. from St. Vladimir Seminary in 1983. He was ordained to the holy priesthood in 1985 and since then has served in parishes in Minnesota, Montana, Michigan and Illinois. Presently his post is as Rector at St. Luke the Evangelist Orthodox Church in Palos Heights IL. Along with his duties as Rector, and parish ministry, Father works as a licensed professional counselor.

Orthodox Women in the Healing Ministries was founded in 1992 with the mission of providing support to Orthodox Christian women who work in the medical and healing professions. This includes doctors, nurses, therapists, social workers and the like. In addition, from the inception of OWHM the founders defined all women as persons who "minister to others," including priest's wives, teachers, students, mothers and the like, and believe they would benefit from our retreat.

## **What is Servant Leadership?**
